

How to Register to Get Your Stimulus Payment

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress passed the CARES Act. Under this Act, most Americans will get an Economic Impact Payment from the IRS. Adults can get up to \$1200 and parents will get up to \$500 for each child they have under the age of 17. Most people will get their check automatically. Others will have to register with the IRS. Please read the information in this guide to see if you need to register.

You should register with the IRS as a non-filer if you:

- Get benefits from the Social Security Administration (SSI, SS Disability and SS Retirement) and have children under age 17. The IRS will automatically issue the adult \$1200 payment in the same way that Social Security pays your benefits each month. However, you must register as a non-filer so you will get the \$500 payment for each of your children.
- Get disability benefits from the US
 Department of Veterans Affairs and
 have children under age 17. The IRS
 will automatically issue the adult \$1200
 payment in the same way that the VA pays
 your benefits each month. However, you
 must register as a non-filer so you will get
 the \$500 payment for each of your children.
- **Did not file taxes in 2018 or 2019.** If you or your spouse had any earned income in

2019, you should file taxes, not register as a non-filer. If you had earned income, you may be eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit. The EITC can be worth up to \$6557 to families with children and \$529 for filers without qualifying children. You can file your taxes online for free at https://www.myfreetaxes.com/

You DO NOT need to register with the IRS as a non-filer if you:

• Filed taxes in 2018 or 2019. You will get the payments for you and your children automatically. The IRS will pay the Economic Impact Payment in the same way they paid your tax refund. If you have new bank information or a new address that you want the IRS to use, you must go to https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/economic-impact-payments and update your information.

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Before you get started, you should have:

- 1. Your Driver's License or State ID number if you do not have either of these, you can still submit the registration to the IRS.
- 2. SSNs for dependents/minor children.
- 3. Your bank account number and routing information, if you want the money direct deposited. Right now the portal is not set up to put this payment on a Direct Expres card. If you get your SS benefit on a Direct Express card, you should still register now, and choose to get a paper check.
- 4. An email account. If you do not have an email account, you can easily set up a Gmail account by going to www.gmail.com.


Register as a Non-Filer with the IRS

STEP 1: Go to IRS webpage: https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/economic-impact-payments

STEP 2: On the homepage, choose the blue **Non-filers: Enter Payment Info Here** button. This will take you to the Free File Fillable Forms secure site.



STEP 3: Click on the **Get Started** button



STEP 4: Create an Account: Choose a username and password. See below if you want to use the 2-step verification process by entering your phone number. This is not required.






2-step verification: For added security, the IRS recommends, but does not require, a 2-step verification. If you do this, enter your phone number on the Create Account page. The "Verify with text message" box will appear with a blue check mark. The IRS






will send you a confirmation text with a 6-digit code. You must enter that code to continue the non-filer registration.

STEP 5: Fill Out Your Tax Form. Enter your name, address, etc and information on your children (your dependents). Enter your bank information if you want to get your money by direct deposit. Right now you cannot register your Direct Express card. You will get your adult payment on your Direct Express card, but the payment for your children will come by a check.



STEP 6: E-File Your Tax Forms. Since you did not file taxes last year, you should enter \$0 for last year's AGI.



STEP 7: Electronic Signature.


- If you do not have a cell phone number, you can skip this question.

STEP 8: Verify your Email.


You must verify your email address before you can submit your form to the IRS. The Continue to E-File button at the bottom of the page will not be active until you verify your email account.

Check your email account for an email from the IRS. Click on the "Confirm my acount's email address" link. Follow the instructions. Go back to your account, and the button should now be blue, which means it is active.



STEP 9: Click on the Continue to E-File button to send your form to the

IRS. Now that you have confirmed your email address, the Continue to E-File button will be dark blue. Click on it to send your form to the IRS. A pop-up will appear, and you will need to click, "I Agree." Then a second pop-up will confirm that your form has been sent.



STEP 10: Check your email. You will get an email from Customer Service at Free File Fillable Forms. It will tell you if there is a problem with your form or if it was successfully sent to the IRS. If there is a problem, the email should tell you how to fix it.

Your return is not complete until it is accepted by the IRS.

https://www.freefilefillableforms.com/#/fd/EconomicImpactPayment and selecting the "Check E-File Status" button.

STEP 11: Check your email again! The day after you get the email in Step 9, check your email again to make sure the IRS has accepted your form. Congratulations – you are now done with the process to get your stimulus money.
