How to build a better schedule

The Buildertrend Scheduling tool is located within the Project Management tab and is the best place to kick off any new job. Like other construction scheduling software, you can digitally build timelines from the comfort of your keyboard - but that's where the similarities end.

Check out these pro tips to make your schedule work for you:

Phases

Organize your schedule by assigning your items to the appropriate phase of the job. Phases will allow you to break your schedule into more manageable sections. You can view your schedule in the Gantt by items and by phases. This is also an option for your homeowners. By limiting them to only phases, your clients can better understand where they're at with their project.

View all jobs in Gantt

When you are project planning and would like to see the highest overview, you can select all listed jobs from the job menu and opt to view them in the Gantt. This would put every schedule item from every job on the Gantt chart. To create this high-level overview, choose to display jobs rather than items. This will show one bar for each job, giving you an overview of start and end dates of all your active projects.

Linked To-Do's

Our digital tools seamlessly work together, so the best teams link To-Do's to Schedule items. This provides the opportunity to associate a preconstruction checklist with onsite responsibilities and tasks. Both the to-do and schedule item will have automated reminders for the assigned individual(s), and the linkage assures that the deadline on the to-do will shift with your production schedule. This eliminates the need to send out a daily email with assignments while establishing the Schedule as the single source of truth. Assign To-Do's to certain members of your team or subs, making it easy to track what's getting done and by who from one spot.

Schedule item confirmation

When scheduling your users (trade partners or internal users), you can require a confirmation when the user is notified of a new schedule item or if the schedule happens to change. This can ensure that the individual receives the schedule item notification and will continue to notify until the item is confirmed.

Conflict prevention

When setting up trade partners and internal users, you have the ability to activate the conflict tracker. You can select the maximum amount overlap this individual user can have and if you reach that threshold, there will be an in-program prompt. This prompt will be activated when you are ready to turn your scheduling live so you will be alerted of the conflicts across all jobs.

Saved filters

Use saved filters in the month view to display other items like To-Do's or deadlines for owner invoices and selections. This will allow you to not only see your project schedule but also other important job-related dates without leaving the month view. To increase usability, you can save this filter and see this information on the calendar each time you access your project management schedule.

OK. Your schedule is built.

Now how should you view your masterpiece?

Not all construction teams work in the same way - and, not all projects work the same way either for that matter. That's why Buildertrend gives you options to view your schedules once they're built and ready to be put to work.

Here are the pros of each available view:

Month, Week or Day

For a bigger picture outlook of what's coming up, Month view is best when choosing to see things by date. Zero in on the details as you get more specific with Week or Day views. Plus, you can view all projects at once or just one at a time.

List view

This is just another way to view what's coming up and when - but not in a calendar format like Month, Week or Day. Tasks will come in as a list with most recent deadlines displaying first.

Gantt

The Gantt view allows you to link and rearrange schedule items with ease. This means when you move one item, the others follow suit and adjust accordingly, keeping everything in order.

Agenda

Interested in seeing how much one person has on their plate? The Agenda view allows you to filter and see what items are assigned to a specific user.

Baseline view

When you complete a schedule, you can next set a baseline. This baseline acts as a screenshot, so if schedule items aren't completed on time or moved, it shows where the time went and why that job is behind.

Workday expectations

This simply shows the days your team works and when you're not, whether it's due to a holiday, rain delays or required extra work on weekends. This view is great for sharing with clients to keep them in the loop.

Phases list

Remember those tags we mentioned earlier? When you assigned tags by phases, you can pop into this view to just see schedule items related to a specific phase of the construction process.



Scheduling to collaborate

Laying out a critical path prioritizes and allocates resources to get the most important tasks done and reschedules any lower priority work that may hinder your team's progress. Using the critical path method optimizes work on the job site without delaying the end results.

Easily implement this method in four steps with the help of our software:

Step 1

Determine the scope of work and timeline

Before you involve our tech, make a list of all necessary work along with how long each task will take. That should give you an idea for how long your timeline should be.

Step 2

Decide on task dependencies

This is where Buildertrend's Schedule feature really comes in handy. Start by entering in your essential tasks. Then, along the way, easily link individual tasks. This will automatically form dependencies.

Step 3


Define your project milestones


